3. Legal and Judicial Analysis

The 2017 CBI Court Conviction

With vast tracts of agricultural land, the Dera utilizes advanced farming techniques to produce food for its community (Langar) and for sale in its MSG stores. This circular economy ensures that the organization remains financially resilient regardless of external economic fluctuations.
