Procedural Execution: Mastering the Plant Osmosis Experiment

A recurring technical requirement in MSCE Biology practicals is the investigation of osmosis using living tissues (typically potato or cassava cylinders). This procedure tests the student's ability to control variables and interpret non-linear data.

Step-by-Step Technical Workflow

1. Preparation of Osmotic Solutions: Prepare a range of sucrose concentrations (e.g., 0.0M, 0.2M, 0.4M, 0.6M, 0.8M, 1.0M). Precision in molarity is crucial for establishing a clear isotonic point.
2. Tissue Standardization: Use a cork borer to extract uniform cylinders of potato tissue. This ensures the surface-area-to-volume ratio remains constant across all samples.
3. Initial Mass Acquisition: Record the mass of each cylinder using a high-precision electronic balance to at least two decimal places.
4. Incubation Period: Submerge the cylinders in the respective solutions for a minimum of 30 to 60 minutes to allow for net water movement across the semi-permeable membranes.
5. Final Measurement and Calculation: Remove, blot dry (to remove excess surface moisture), and re-weigh. Calculate the percentage change in mass using the formula: $\% \text{ Change} = \frac{(\text{Final Mass} - \text{Initial Mass})}{\text{Initial Mass}} \times 100$.

The point where the curve crosses the x-axis on a graph of sucrose concentration vs. percentage change in mass represents the internal osmotic concentration of the tissue.

The Role of Marking Instructions in Academic Success
